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
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**NASCIO Executive Director Elected as National Academy for Public Administration Fellow**

LEXINGTON, Ky., (November 28, 2012) – National Association of State Chief Information Officers (NASCIO) Executive Director Doug Robinson was recently selected as a Fellow by the National Academy of Public Administration (NAPA). Robinson was inducted along with 43 others during the academy’s fall meeting on November 15, in Washington, D.C.
